Good Morning Deputy J. Alexander,

Thank you for taking the time to speak on the phone yesterday. As discussed, here is my statement:

Sunday, August 9, 2020, I was enroute to Barstow, CA to pick up my husband who was being driven in from San Bernardino, CA. Not sure this information is relevant, but thought I would include it anyways. My family was on vacation in Alabama and Florida from July 29th - August 8th, and my husband drove my grandfather's car back from Alabama to California for my aunt (which is why I was meeting him in Barstow to pick him up). Around 6pm, I was already driving to Barstow when I received notice through Facebook posts that there were 60+ dogs abandoned in the desert. Originally it was said they were dumped and roaming free (based on comments), then it changed to "they were left in cages". Photos started being shared and "facebook posts" started saying it was a "dump spot". Being a rescue, and already enroute to Barstow, I started to chime into the posts asking where the dogs were located and what I could do to help as I was already on my way to Barstow. I was added to a group chat and provided with a meeting location. Originally I thought I was going out to the place where all of the dogs were abandoned, but then I was told most of the dogs were already moved to a safer location where rescues that could help could meet to pickup dogs. I asked how many dogs were left as they stated rescue groups from California were coming out to help also. No one could give me an answer. At this point, I sent a message out to my volunteer team asking for immediate transport volunteers not knowing what we would find when we arrived, just knowing there were 60 something dogs abandoned in cages that needed rescue ASAP. Other rescues in Vegas were offering to help, but none could make the drive out and didn't have anywhere to house any dogs overnight, so I offered up our kennel resource and said everyone was welcome to take any dogs they could take in there for the night and move them to their vets the next day. I let the group of rescuers and volunteers know I had other volunteers on their way out and that we would take as many dogs as possible back, book them into the kennels for the night, and then work out the details of which rescues were taking who from there.

When I arrived at the meeting spot, which was near a bar called The Barn, it was around 8:15pm. There were 2 volunteers from other Vegas rescue groups there, a mid-sized public transportation type bus (which I assume was used to transport the dogs from where they were at originally) and a large Truck. I approached the people and identified myself as Chelsea with SNARL and asked how I could help. There were 17 dogs at the meeting spot left and I let them know I had other vehicles on their way with supplies to help transport the dogs back to Vegas. I asked how many dogs there were left at the original place and they said they had counted 14. I asked where all the other dogs went and they said other rescues picked them up already. I know a rescue in LA took 6 puppies (www.stmartinsrescue.org) and it was mentioned that Orange County Shepherd Rescue and another rescue in Chino (not sure who) were taking dogs also.

The two volunteers, that were already at the meeting spot when I arrived, each loaded up two dogs in their vehicles and drove them back to Vegas to our kennels. My husband, who I picked up in Barstow, loaded up two dogs in our SUV and drove back. I stayed behind at the meeting spot with the other people and remaining dogs until my volunteer arrived. There were 11 dogs left at this point when my volunteers arrived, so we loaded up the remaining 11 dogs and transported them back out to Vegas to our kennel resource.

When I arrived to the kennels (around 1:45 am), I was told the 6 dogs that had left while I was there, had all checked in. I was also informed that another vehicle with 6 dogs had arrived and dropped off 6 dogs. I asked around to see who it was, and was told it was a volunteer that dove all the way out from Apple Valley. I guess they had arrived to

the meeting spot before me, loaded up 6 dogs, and started heading back out to Vegas. We unloaded the last 11 dogs from our cars and then headed home for the night. So we had a total of 23 dogs in Vegas.

On Monday, August 10th, the other rescues in Vegas started asking when they could go out to boarding and pick-out dogs. Two rescues went to boarding and took a total of 8 dogs combined. One took 5, and the other took 3. The rescues took them straight to their vets for health evaluations and intake vetting. My rescue (SNARL) had taken 3 dogs straight to foster the night of pick-up). The 3 we moved to foster for the night, were then checked into our vets yesterday for health evaluations and intake medical care to include: vaccines, fecals, microchips, and alteration procedures.

Around 4pm I received your email and called you back as soon as I saw it. And per our phone conversation around 6:00 pm on 08/10/2020, you informed me fully of the situation at hand and advised that there is a risk the owners of the dogs (who are currently incarcerated) may request to reclaim these dogs when they are released from jail. Per our phone discussion, I asked you if it was okay to proceed with providing basic medical care and vetting for the dogs, and you stated that it was a weird situation because the owners may try to reclaim, but if we felt the need to provide medical care for the dogs, you couldn't advise us not to.

Per our conversation yesterday, we will proceed with vetting these dogs as deemed required by Clark County Law. This vetting includes, but is not limited to: Vaccines (DAPP2, Bordatella, and Rabies) and alteration procedures. In the event that the dogs require additional medical attention due to upper respiratory infections, internal or external parasites, ear and eye infections, diarrhea or vomiting, common skin disorders, urinary track infections, etc., we will also have our vets treat as necessary. We will provide basic housing and grooming services while the dogs are in our care.

Per our conversation, we also discussed that we will be putting a hold on these dog's adoptions pending the completion of the hearing/investigation. You stated on our call that you would be in touch with us sometime next week if you needed anything additional from us. If we don't hear back from you within the next 2 weeks, we will assume we are clear to proceed with finding adopting homes for the 23 dogs that were transported back to Las Vegas.

I wish I had more information for you regarding what person or group started the rescue mission, but unfortunately I don't. I asked around but could not get an definitive answer. I think by the time it had reached the Las Vegas rescue community, it was already a game of telephone.

If there is anything additional I can provide to you, please let me know. We are happy to provide medical documentation for the dogs, photos, etc. And your team is welcome to come out and visit if needed as well.
